CLUB/MEMBERS NEWS

Pen Pals BIG event takes place on Thursday, 7 November, at 6.30pm at the Dalziel St Andrews Church, Pollock Street, Motherwell. We have organised, with the support of North Lanarkshire Council, a writing competition for three High Schools. This has been ongoing since August with over 100 entries in four sections (Short Story/Flash Fiction/Poetry and a Theme story).

Sophie McKenzie (new book 'Split Second') is judging the Short Story and has personally signed four copies of her new novel as part of the prizes. Silvie Taylor well known Book Reviewer and Author (and former SAW President) is coming to judge the Theme Story (Creepy House) and two Head Teachers of English are judging Flash Fiction and Poetry.

Among our guests are Andrew Sutherland, Executive Director of Education & Leisure, Ian Livingston, Chairman Supercounty 2013 and John Scott, Executive Director of NLC. We have 40 winning pupils, along with parents, relatives and friend, joining the above guests and School Rectors and teachers. Prize money of £400 will be divided in each section (Winner/Runner up/Highly Commended and Commended)

This is our first pilot scheme and fingers crossed it will be very successful!

We are a group of 12, so a big undertaking but we have all enjoyed preparing for this. Anyone is welcome to attend on the 7th.

talking to us about her writing experiences. We will end the season on a jolly note, when some of the SAW council members join us at our meeting on 17 December.





Uuganaa Ramsay, the Janetta Bowie Chalice for a non-fiction book winner. 2012, has her first book, ***Mongol*** published in January, 2014.

Uuganaa is a Mongol living in Britain, far from the world she grew up in: as a nomadic herder she lived in a yurt, eating marmot meat, distilling vodka from goat's yoghurt and learning about Comrade Lenin. When her new-born son Billy is diagnosed with Down's Syndrome, she finds herself facing bigotry and taboo as well as heartbreak.

In this powerful memoir, Uuganaa skillfully interweaves the extraordinary story of her own childhood in Mongolia with the sadly short life of Billy, who becomes a symbol of union and disunion, cultures and complexity, stigma and superstition - and inspires Uuganaa to challenge prejudice. ***Mongol*** is the touching story of one woman's transformation from outsider to fearless champion of love, respect and tolerance. It's a moving tribute by a remarkable woman to her beloved baby son, testifying to his lasting impact on a sometimes imperfect world.

Uuganaa has been interviewed by the Sunday Express and Daily Record.
