Victoria Gemmell lives in Renfrewshire and her debut Young Adult novel *Follow Me* is out now, published by Strident Publishing Ltd. Victoria works with teenagers on a daily basis as a careers adviser.

Victoria has had shorter works published in journals such as the WordswithJAM anthology, *An Earthless Melting Pot*, The Grind Journal, The Puffin Review, FlashFlood, Word Bohemia and The Bohemyth Literary Journal, writing under the name Vikki.

About Follow Me

Follow Me is a Young Adult mystery novel, with underlying romance. It centres around 17 year old Kat Sullivan who has been devastated by the loss of her twin sister, Abby. No-one seems able to explain the circumstances surrounding her death, and as Kat searches for answers she is drawn into the mysterious and creative world of the Barn, an underground hangout modelled on the Pop Artist Andy Warhol's infamous Factory studio.



"During my undergraduate degree in Communication and Mass Media I developed a fascination with Andy Warhol. His art and the concepts behind it, inspired a lot of the themes in my book."

"I first attended the Scottish Association of Writers conference when I was about seventeen, (around the time I joined Erskine Writers). I have my Mum, Rosemary, to thank for encouraging me to start engaging with other writers and to share my work. I still remember Ian Rankin's key note speech my first year at SAW, (I think this was when he was just on the cusp of becoming massive), and being so inspired by spending a weekend with such enthusiastic and encouraging writers."

"It took a good few years for me to build up the confidence to start entering any of the SAW competitions. The crits and encouragement I received from writers such as Chris Longmuir and Maggie Craig really meant a lot when I was just starting out (and from Alex Gray and Jacklin Murray in Erskine Writers)."
